McDavid's Overtime Heroics Secure Canada's 3-2 Victory Over U.S. in 4 Nations Face-Off Final

In a thrilling conclusion to the inaugural 4 Nations Face-Off tournament, Canada edged out the United States with a 3-2 overtime victory on Thursday night in Boston.

Connor McDavid delivered the decisive goal at 8:18 into the extra period, clinching the championship for Team Canada.

The atmosphere at TD Garden was electric, with Canadian players and fans celebrating as "O Canada" resonated throughout the arena. The tournament, featuring teams from Canada, the U.S., Finland, and Sweden, served as a prelude to the upcoming 2026 Winter Olympics and intensified the storied rivalry between the North American neighbors.

The game was not only a showcase of elite hockey talent but also a reflection of current geopolitical tensions. Recent political discourse, including discussions about annexation and national pride, added an extra layer of intensity to the matchup. Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau remarked on social media, "You can't take our country—and you can't take our game," in response to provocative statements about Canada's sovereignty.

Nathan MacKinnon, who was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player, opened the scoring for Canada early in the first period. The U.S. responded with goals from Brady Tkachuk and Jake Sanderson, taking a 2-1 lead. However, Sam Bennett equalized for Canada in the second period, setting the stage for a tense and scoreless third period.

The tournament garnered significant attention, partly due to the political undertones surrounding the games. Fans from both nations were deeply invested, with passionate displays of national pride throughout the event. The success of the 4 Nations Face-Off has set the stage for heightened anticipation as teams prepare for the 2026 Winter Olympics, where the rivalry between Canada and the United States is expected to reach new heights.

As part of this upgrade, the City will also reinstate paid parking in these garages, effective March 3, 2025.

The upgraded system will be implemented across the following City-owned parking garages:

John Street Parking Garage (16 John St.)
West Tower Parking Garage (41 George St. S.)
City Hall Parking Garage (2 Wellington St. W.)
Market Square Parking Garage (1 Theatre Ln.)
Nelson Square Parking Garage (2 Diplock Ln.)

These garages offer accessible parking spaces, electric vehicle charging stations, and bike racks to accommodate a variety of users.

When contacted for his comments, Regional Councillor Paul Vicente praised the initiative, emphasizing the benefits for residents and businesses.

"The modernization of downtown Brampton's parking garages is a necessary step in improving accessibility, security, and overall user experience. This new gateless system will reduce congestion at entry points and provide a seamless parking experience for residents, businesses, and visitors. Said Vicente.

He further added that "with the first two hours free and competitive rates, this system balances affordability with innovation while ensuring that our downtown remains a vibrant and welcoming destination,"

Sunwing Cancels Multiple Flights from Pearson, Citing Weather and Crew Shortages



Toronto Pearson International Airport saw several Sunwing Airlines flights grounded on Wednesday as the airline cited weather disruptions, crew shortages, and limited hotel availability as reasons for the cancellations.

According to a travel advisory issued by Sunwing, the decision was made to prioritize returning stranded passengers from vacation destinations back to Canada.

Sunwing assured affected passengers that they will receive a full refund within 21 business days. Customers booked through Sunwing Vacations for flights scheduled between February 13 and 19—who experienced delays of more than 24 hours—have been given options to:

Rebook on rescheduled flights,

Make a one-time change to their departure date, or

Cancel their trip altogether.

At Pearson Airport, departure boards showed 30 scheduled Sunwing flights for the day, of which 14 were canceled and three others were delayed.

With ongoing operational challenges, travelers are advised to check their flight status and plan accordingly.

Poll Shows Liberal-Conservative Race Tightens with Carney as Leader

A new Angus Reid survey reveals that voter support between the Liberal and Conservative parties narrows significantly if Mark Carney were to lead the Liberals, bringing the race to a near deadlock.

According to the poll, Conservatives hold 40% support, while Liberals climb to 37% under Carney's hypothetical leadership. The NDP sees a significant drop, losing nearly half its support from 21% to 10%, as left-leaning voters shift toward the Liberals.

Key Findings:


Ontario Remains a Battleground: Liberal and Conservative support is neck-and-neck, with 45% backing the Conservatives and 44% supporting the Liberals.

Quebec Vote Split: The Liberals (31%) and Bloc Québécois (30%) are tied, with the Conservatives trailing by nine points.

Poilievre's Rising Unfavourability: Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre is viewed unfavorably by 56% of Canadians, marking his highest negative rating since taking over leadership.

Jagmeet Singh's Struggles: The NDP leader holds the lowest net favorability rating (-25), with support remaining positive only among young women.

Delta Offers \$30,000 to Passengers After Fiery Crash Landing in Toronto

Delta Air Lines is offering \$30,000 in compensation to each passenger aboard the flight that crash-landed at Toronto Pearson International Airport earlier this week. A company spokesperson confirmed Wednesday that the payout comes with "no strings attached" and will not affect passengers' legal rights.

The Delta Flight 4819, operated by subsidiary Endeavor Air, was carrying 76 passengers and four crew members when it made a hard landing at Pearson on Monday. Video footage shows the aircraft tipping over, its wing scraping the ground before bursting into flames and coming to a stop in a cloud of smoke. Passengers scrambled to evacuate as emergency crews rushed to the scene.

Investigators are still working to determine what caused the crash. The Transportation Safety Board of Canada (TSB) confirmed Wednesday that the aircraft's black box has been recovered and that the wreckage will be moved to a hangar for further examination. Officials will also inspect the runway before reopening it.

Two of Pearson's five runways-including Canada's busiestremain closed, contributing to flight cancellations and delays. Sunwing Airlines alone canceled 13 departures on Wednesday, prioritizing the return of stranded passengers.

Delta CEO Ed Bastian praised the swift response of first responders and reassured travelers that air travel remains the safest mode of transportation. He emphasized that pilots regularly train for emergency scenarios like Monday's crash.



Though 21 passengers were hospitalized, all but one had been discharged by Wednesday morning. Some passengers, however, are now seeking legal action. A Toronto-based aviation law firm confirmed it is representing two Canadian passengers who sustained injuries, including one with a possible head injury. The firm is also collaborating with U.S. lawyers representing American passengers.

Experts speculate that gusty winds and possible landing gear failure may have played a role in the crash, but the TSB has cautioned that it is too early to draw conclusions.

For now, as crews work to clear the wreckage and restore operations, delays at Pearson Airport are expected to continue.




